



ADVENTURES IN ALSACE

SEPTEMBER 20TH - 28TH 2019

Dear Travelers to Alsace,

When Alsace is mentioned, French citizens become quite emotional. Until the treaty that ended the Franco-Prussian War (1870-1871) which ceded the province to Germany, it had been French since the 17th century. After being German for almost 50 years, it was again French from 1918 until France was defeated in 1940. Finally, after 4 years of German occupation, it was returned to France in November 1944.

If I start my letter with this tumultuous history, it is because this past gives Alsace its own distinct identity, language, cuisine and architecture. Lying between the Rhine River and the Vosges mountains, the province is a lovely region of France characterized by pretty villages with half-timbered houses overflowing with flowers, and historic castles on hilltops. We will be staying in Colmar, the birthplace of Frédéric Bartholdi, the sculptor of the Statue of Liberty, and the home of the Unterlinden Museum, and we will visit Strasbourg, the capital of Alsace and the formal seat of the European Parliament, famous for its Gothic cathedral made of pink sandstone. We will drive on country roads meandering through vineyards ready to be harvested, walk in villages with both French and German-sounding names, climb the Route des Crêtes (road of the peaks) which will give us magnificent views of the surrounding landscape and visit the Beauvillé table linen factory and shop which have been in operation since the 18th century.

Alsace has its signature bird, the white stork, which in late September will have departed for warmer climates but whose nests will be clearly visible on chimney tops. It is, as you know, a symbol of fertility and also a sign of good luck.

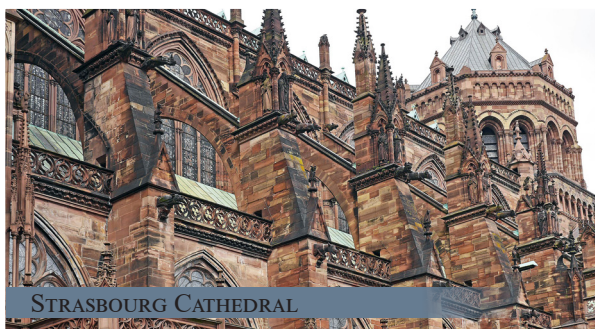
Even if you think you know the country well, you will be surprised by what you see and hear during your discovery of this eastern part of France.

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FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 20TH - Depart from your chosen US gateway city. **Overnight: Plane**

SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 21ST - Your arrival at the Basel/Mulhouse Euro Airport will be met for the transfer to our hotel in Colmar - just 45 minutes away. After checking in, there will be free time to unpack, relax from the flight and begin exploring the neighborhood. A welcome dinner is included this evening. **(D) Overnight: Colmar**

SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 22ND - This morning we will take a walking tour of Colmar. We'll see the Dominican Church, an excellent example of early Gothic architecture; the Koifhus, or old Customs House, which has been an economic and political hub since the 16th century; the Pfister House, a beautiful blend of medieval and Renaissance architecture and one of the finest old houses in Colmar; and Little Venice, a charming district made

up of colorful half-timbered houses neatly lined up on either side of Colmar's canal. We'll end our tour at the Unterlinden Museum (the home of Grünewald's Isenheim Altarpiece). After lunch (included), we'll visit the Hansi Museum. The rest of afternoon and evening are free to further explore this delightful city. **(B, L) Overnight: Colmar**

MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 23RD - Today we visit the nearby city of Strasbourg - just an hour drive north. Our morning tour includes the major landmarks of the city, such as Maison Kammerzell, Gutenberg square, St. Thomas church, the former tanners' houses, the Covered Bridge and much more. We'll end our tour with a guided visit of Notre Dame de Strasbourg, the medieval cathedral of the city, and then take a short boat ride on the canals, affording wonderful views of Strasbourg's beautiful architecture. The afternoon is free for individual exploration - perhaps pay a visit to the Palais Rohan, a grand 18th-century palace now housing a variety of wonderful museums, including the Fine Arts Museum with its wonderful collections. We'll return to Colmar in time for you to find dinner at a local restaurant. **(B) Overnight: Colmar**



TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 24TH - This morning we'll visit the Ecomuseum of Alsace in Ungersheim, just to the south of Colmar. The Alsace Ecomuseum has gathered 70 authentic country houses, dismantled piece by piece and brought from their villages of origin, where they were condemned to disappear. Over the years and thanks to the contributions of thousands of enthusiasts, the Ecomuseum has become one of the major open-air folk museums in Europe, with its village, fields and forest totaling around 100 hectares. We'll spend the afternoon in the village of Eguisheim, voted "Favorite French Village" in 2013, and birthplace of Pope Leo IX. After lunch (included), we'll stop at the Domaine Emile Beyer in Eguisheim for a tasting of, among other things, his excellent Crémant d'Alsace. From here we return to Colmar for a free evening. **(B, L) Overnight: Colmar**

WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 25TH - Our first stop today is at the Parc de la Marseillaise in Guebwiller, a public arboretum and botanical garden in the French style. From here we continue to Hartmannswillerkopf, also known as the Vieil Armand, one of four national monuments to World War I. It is possible to visit well-preserved trenches as well as the cemetery on a site that has over 1,200 graves. We'll stop for lunch at the nearby Ferme-Auberge Freundstein for some local delicacies, and then take the long way back to Colmar, along the "Route des Crêtes" and up into the Vosges Mountains. Often described as the most spectacular drive in northern France, the name literally means the road along the crests, and it was carved out by the French army engineers during World War I. We pass mountain lakes in extinct volcano craters and see the magnificent views from the Grand Ballon before we return down into Colmar for a free evening. **(B, L) Overnight: Colmar**

THURSDAY, SEPTEMBER 26TH - Today we set out along the Alsatian Wine Route for the Domaine Halbeisen, a traditional family wine estate that has been making wine in wooden barrels since 1737. We'll hear about the family's production process while enjoying a tasting of several of their wines. We'll have lunch here and then return to Colmar for a visit to the Bartholdi Museum, commemorating work by the sculptor Auguste Bartholdi, creator of the Statue of Liberty. The museum was Bartholdi's childhood home and his family's belongings are on display, as well as models of his monuments from several towns. A special place is reserved for the original models of Bartholdi's masterpieces, the Statue of Liberty and the Lion of Belfort. The evening is free. **(B, L) Overnight: Colmar**



FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 27TH - Our excursion today gives us an in-depth look at another section of the Alsace Wine Route. Heading north out of the city we enter the Ballons des Vosges National Park at the picturesque village of Ribeauvillé, with parts of its ancient town walls still intact and dominated by the nearby ruins of the Château Ulric, perched high above the village. The town is also famous for its hand-made linens and tableware and we'll pay a visit to a local factory. We then proceed to the village of Riquewihr, classified as one of the most beautiful villages of France. After free time for lunch, we'll take a walking tour and admire the architecture that has remained largely unchanged since the 16th century. Riquewihr was one of the few towns to not be badly damaged during World War II, and its medieval fortifications still surround the town. We return to Colmar for a festive farewell dinner of Alsatian specialties. **(B, D)**

SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 28TH - Morning transfers to Basel/Mulhouse Euro Airport for returning flights to the U.S. **(B)**

Key to included meals: B - breakfast, L - lunch, D - dinner

YOUR HOST: CATHERINE LAFARGE

Leading your trip will be Catherine Lafarge, Professor Emerita of French at Bryn Mawr College. A native of France, Lafarge came to the United States in 1957 as a Fulbright scholar at Mt. Holyoke College, where she earned her bachelor's degree. She began teaching at Bryn Mawr in 1966, immediately upon earning her doctorate from Yale University. She chaired the French Department from 1979 to 1984 and also from 1996 to 1991; she served as dean of the GSAS from 1985 to 1995. In October, 2004 Professor Lafarge was awarded France's Ordre des Palmes Academiques in a ceremony in the Ely Room of Wyndham House. The order, instituted in 1808 by Napoleon I, honors those who have made significant contributions to the understanding of French culture throughout the world. Throughout her career, Lafarge has been active in numerous professional societies, particularly the American Society for Eighteenth-Century Studies, which she served as treasurer. Among the honors she has won are grants from the American Philosophical Society and the American Council of Learned Societies, as well as the Mt. Holyoke Alumnae Association's prestigious Sesquicentennial Award.
